# Patach — To Open

## **Design and Sefirah**

The *patach* is displayed as a straight line (similar to a horizontal *vav*). The *patach* represents the <u>Sefirah</u> of Chochmah<sup>1</sup>—the flash of an idea or wisdom. It alludes to the horizontal line of thought, as explained in the letter *hei*.

## Gematria

The numerical value of the *patach* is six, corresponding to the *gematria* of the letter <u>vav</u>.



# Meaning

To open; to have a glimmer of what was previously closed and to acquire knowledge.
